Universal Screening Costs Less

Current Referral-Based Process

Hiring many proctors

to assess students on Saturdays or afterschool with a high-stakes test, often in an **unfamiliar location**

Universal Screening

No new assessment needed, if district already has sufficient data on file

Any screening administered by the classroom teacher

Proctors only needed for small group follow-up assessments

Case Study: Northshore School District (23,000 students)

- Universally screens **3 grade levels** (K, 1st, 5th) plus all newly enrolled students
- Screener: Naglieri Nonverbal Abilities Test (NNAT3) in the classroom
- Proctors give the Iowa Math & Reading in small groups when more data is needed
- Also uses **existing district data** to screen/qualify (WAKids, IRR, iReady, ELPA21, SBA)
- Prior to universal screening, Northshore's entire HiCap grant was used for fixed costs and assessment, largely because of the high number of proctors needed for Saturday testing
- Universal screening created a cost savings for Assessment of **nearly 50%**
