In Washington State we underidentify Highly Capable students.

● English Language Learners	10x
● Low income students	2.4x
● Students with disabilities	2.3x

With Universal screening and local norms, **Northshore School District** identified **11x** more low income students, English Language Learners, and Students with Disabilities in 2020 than in 2016.

In **Kent, WA** Black and Hispanic representation **TRIPLED** over the course of nine years with the use of universal screening, local norms, and providing HiCap services at every school.
